

He asked his disciples, "Who do people say the Son of Man is?"


14 They replied, "Some say John the Baptist; others say Elijah; and still others, Jeremiah or one of the prophets."

18 And I tell you that you are Peter, **and on this rock I will build my church**, and the gates of Hades will not overcome it. **Matthew 16**






9 "Then, Lord," Simon Peter replied, "not just my feet but my hands and my head as well!"


